It was a sad day on 6 July, to hear that the great mentor and friend Reg Pearce passed away.

Reg and Val were instrumental in the establishment of Young Life mission in Australia. There are so many great stories and blessings to countless young leaders, staff, and kids both in Australia and into Asia.

Reg met with Cliff Johnson when Cliff and Liz settled in Australia in the early 70's. He was instrumental in bringing Charles (Chuck) Lehman and Anne to live in Australia with their kids Doug and Kathy. These couples helped grow the mission locally.

His enthusiasm for the Young Life mission to grow in Australia was boosted by his visits to the US taking Aussie adults on visits to summer camps. On one of those trips he secured the 'Point Person' idea and the fantastic 'pastoral' visits organised with John Miller and his wife Beverley, and Bob Reeverts and his wife Anne.

He was a coordinator of High School Sport in Victoria. Reg took tours to the USA, in a sort of 'exchange', where the Americans brought Basketball teams here, and he took a whole AFL footy team of high school kids to a USA experience!

He was friend and co-organiser of some great Basketball games with Lindsay Gaze, father of Aussie player Andrew Gaze, and the then Melbourne Tigers. The 'Allstar' American kids were beaten by the Tigers despite them winning every High School, and suburban comp team they played.

But above all, was Reg's dedication to the growth of Young Life where he was chairman of the 'southern chapter' in Victoria, along with Stuart McPhail (and his wife Joan) who was the 'northern chapter' chairman of Young Life in NSW. Together they championed the cause with the growth of a board for the establishment of Young Life Australia, and the exciting and growing mission in the late 70's.

Reg established solid connections with the local schools, and he was a constant mentor and friend.

There will be many former leaders in YL welcoming Reg into the presence of Jesus, and many more here, remembering and celebrating the one who took them to faith in Jesus Christ as kids.

Catching the African Fire



It's Saturday Afternoon, Day 3 of Conference. Our mini bus pulls off the main road, and down a steep road, descending into a sunken neighbourhood of Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. As the bus crawls along this rough, narrow track the faces of many women and children stare back at us, the foreign visitors. We park seemingly in the middle of the road, and get out to walk a windy, up and down path, until we begin to

the hear the familiar sound of clapping and "Jambo" being sang with joy across the neighbourhood. We arrive at our destination, the patio and home of Young Life leader, David and his father.



This is their campaigner (small group) meeting place, and we are invited to join in the singing and dance,

first an energetic song of welcome, and then a heart felt song of praise. All sung in Swahili, but we have learnt quickly that the Holy Spirit transcends language barriers, we don't need to hear English to understand the heart.

We engage in a Discovery Bible Study session (known locally as DBS), as our quide Lavina switches translating between English and Swahili.

David then gets a chance to tell his story, how a Young Life Leader found him, encouraged him to join the soccer team, and shared Jesus with him. Now David gets the chance to do the same with other younger boys in his neighbourhood.

I am struck again by the difference knowing Jesus can make in the life of a young person. Whether in the neighbourhoods of Tanzania, the slums of India or the schools in Barossa Valley, Young Life leaders bring hope, invitations to participate in community and adventure, and opportunities to say yes to Jesus. Every young person has the right to know about Jesus - that's what Jim Rayburn Young Life founder says. 80 years

on, it's still 100% true, and Young Life is a vehicle for making that happen.


We were both privileged to be invited to attend the Young Life Africa and Middle East edition of the Global Leadership Conference, in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania in June.

Chaplaincy A life-line in the bush

Young Life Australia has been a National Chaplaincy Program provider since 2007. For one of our chaplains in far Central West NSW. the need for ongoing support for young people in schools is dire.

Last year Amy* sought help with issues she was experiencing. She was very distressed, couldn't focus in class, had difficulty maintaining friendships and was in constant conflict with their carer (an unrelated adult). Amy had a pattern of transient behaviour, was often moving between family members, and on one occasion participated in illicit drug use, exhibiting paranoid behaviour. Being located in an isolated rural community,

there are no mental health support services available close by. As a chaplain, and with permission from the school and other parties



involved, our chaplain was able to accompany Amy to a GP and advocated for her to receive a mental health care plan which included urgent mental health intervention.

As a result of the advocacy and support given to her through the chaplaincy role, Amy was able to have immediate assessment, treatment, and ongoing counselling, and as a result this has completely turned her life around.

She is currently high functioning in school, has improved peer relationships and has now settled living with her biological mother. That is good news!
